Ian Stewart is a science writer, science fiction writer, and professor of mathematics at the University of Warwick in England. To the general public, he is best known for his popular science writing on mathematical themes. He has authored over 30 books that open the universe of mathematics to non-mathematicians as well as scripting and presenting several television and radio shows. In 1995 he was awarded the Royal Society's Michael Faraday Medal for furthering the public understanding of science.

Professor Ian Stewart is the University of Auckland's first Seelye Fellow.
